HERDING DOGS | A Farmer's Best Friend

What is a herding dog?

A herding dog (also known as a stock dog or a working dog), is a type of dog that has an **instinctive skill and drive for herding!** It has either been trained in herding or belongs to breeds that are specifically developed (over hundreds of years) for herding.

What do herding dogs do on a farm?


Herding dogs are used on farms to:

- Gather and herd farm animals (like sheep, goats, cattle, or chickens).
- Cut or separate livestock from the rest of the herd or flock.
- Keep livestock away from the human handler while he or she is placing feed in a trough.
- Move livestock from one pen or pasture to another.

What is a watchdog?

A watchdog is a dog used to **watch property and sound the alarm** against unwanted or unexpected human or animal intruders. Watchdogs are very alert, have the instinctive skill and drive for protection, and a loud bark!

Watchdogs are used on farms to:


- Watch and protect farm animals (like sheep, goats, cattle, or chickens) from wild animals (like cougars, wolves, coyotes, and other species).
- Watch and protect farm equipment, property, and animals from theft.


















GUARD DOGS | Strong and Protective!

What is a guard dog?

Like a watchdog, a guard dog is used to watch property and sound the alarm against unwanted or unexpected human or animal intruders. The main difference between a watchdog and a guard dog is that a guard dog is capable of attacking and/or restraining intruders.

What do guard dogs do on a farm?

Guard dogs are used on farms to:

- Guard farm animals (like sheep, goats, cattle, or chickens) from wild animals (like cougars, wolves, coyotes, and other species).
- Guard farm equipment, property, and animals from theft.




COMMON CALLS FOR FARMHAND DOGS

- "Come by" move clockwise.
- "Away to me" move counter-clockwise
- "Lie down" stop and lie down.
- "Steady" slow down
- "Walk up" walk towards livestock
- "Get out" move away from livestock
- "Cast" gather livestock
- "That'll do" work is complete
- "Here" turn in and walk at farm animals
- "Sit" sit and do not jump
- "Stay" stay in the same position
- "Down" lie down
- "Come" come to owner
- "Heel" walk at owner's side
- "No" stop action
- "Quiet" do not bark
- "Speak" bark

BC DOG TREATS

Your favourite pup will love these healthy treats made with BC ingredients!

BC Pumpkin Dog Biscuits

Yields: 30 biscuits

Ingredients:

1 cupCooked BC Pumpkin (or Canned Pumpkin)250 ml2 cupsWhole Wheat Flour500 ml1BC Egg1½ tspDried Ginger3 ml



Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F (176° C).
- 2. Put BC Pumpkin in a large mixing bowl.
- 3. In a separate bowl, whip the BC Egg. Then, add it to the pumpkin, and mix well.
- 4. Slowly add the flour and dried ginger, stir, and then transfer to a non-stick surface.
- 5. Knead the dough until well-mixed. Then, roll it out on a floured surface until it is $\frac{1}{2}$ " (1 cm) thick.
- 6. Cut the dough into 1" (2.5 cm) squares using a pizza cutter or knife (or you can use a cookie cutter).
- 7. Bake for 30 minutes or until golden brown.
- 8. Cool treats completely and store them in an airtight container at room temperature.

BC Cheddar Bacon Dog Treats

Yields: 10 biscuits

Ingredients:

0.				
1 ½ cups	BC Rolled Oats	375 ml		
½ cup	BC Cheddar Cheese, shredded	125 ml		
4 strips	BC Bacon, cooked and crumbled	4 strips		
2	BC Eggs	2		
2 tbsp	All-Purpose Flour	30 ml		



Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F (176° C).
- 2. Add BC Rolled Oats, BC Cheese, and BC Bacon in a food processor and process for about 1 minute or until ingredients reach a crumb-like consistency.
- 3. Add two BC Eggs to a food processor and process until the mixture resembles a sticky dough.
- 4. Sprinkle flour on a cutting board or flat surface and roll out the dough to about ¼ inch (½ cm) thick. Using a cookie cutter, cut out treats from the dough.
- 5. Transfer dog treats to a parchment-lined baking sheet and cook for 30 minutes.
- 6. Cool treats completely and store them in an airtight container at room temperature.
