

FLOWER AND BUG MARBLE MAGNET FUN


CREATE YOUR OWN FARM MAGNETS!

WHAT YOU NEED

- Small pictures (see below)
- White glue
- Flat glass marbles 1" (25 mm) recommended
- Small round magnets with adhesive backing 1" (25 mm) recommended

HOW TO MAKE

- Choose an image below (or find fun images from magazines, newspapers, wrapping paper, etc.). Place a glass marble that is about the same size as your image over the image. Trace around the marble and then cut out your picture.
- Apply a thin layer of white glue to the back of your marble (the flat side). Place the marble onto the picture and press down. Don't worry if it looks blurry, the glue will clear up. Set the marble aside to dry (about 1 hour).
- Peel the adhesive on the magnet and attach the magnet to the flat side of the marble.
- Hang your beautiful creation on your fridge!


WHAT YOU NEED

- · Blank paper, chalkboard, or dry erase board
- Pencils or dry erase markers
- 1-minute timer
- Spring Agriculture slips (below) printed, and cut)
- Jar

HOW TO MAKE

- Divide into 2 or more teams of 2 or more players.
- Set the scoring goal (for example first team to 10).
- Get your drawing supplies and timer in place.
- Pick a team to go first. Choose the first player on the team to draw a slip from the jar.
- Set the timer to 1-minute.
- Start the round. The player must then draw the word on the slip on the blank paper or dry erase board. Teammates must then work together in order to guess what the sketcher is drawing.
- Score points. Once a team guesses the word correctly within 1 minute, they receive 1 point. If they don't guess correctly, they receive 0 points for the round.
- Rotate teams until the scoring goal is met.






PLANT A BUTTERFLY GARDEN








HOW TO GROW A PLANT

BC RAINBOW FRUIT SALAD

Make a colourful salad with BC grown fruits!

Yields: 4 Servings

INGREDIENTS

IIIOILE	1415	
1 cup	BC Raspberries	250 ml
1 cup	BC Apricots or Peaches	250 ml
1 cup	BC Pears	250 ml
1 cup	BC Kiwifruit or Green Apples	250 ml
1 cup	BC Blueberries or Blackberries	250 ml
1 cup	BC Vanilla Yogurt	250 ml
4 tbsp	BC Honey	60 ml

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Combine first 5 ingredients in large bowl and mix. Then transfer to 4 small dessert bowls.
- 2. Top each serving of fruit salad with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of BC Vanilla Yogurt.
- 3. Drizzle 1 tbsp of BC Honey on top of yogurt.
- 4. Serve and enjoy!

INGREDIENTS

4	Whole Wheat Pita Breads	4
1 cup	BBQ sauce	250ml
2 cups	BC Chicken, cooked and shredded	500 ml
4 tbsp	BC Red Onions, chopped in ¼"	60 ml
	(½ cm) pieces	
2 cups	BC Mozzarella Cheese	500 ml
4 tbsp	BC Basil and/or BC Mint, finely	60 ml
	chopped	

DIRECTIONS


- 1. Preheat oven to 425 F (220 C). Place pitas on ungreased baking sheet.
- 2. Spoon $\frac{1}{4}$ cup (60 ml) of the BBQ sauce on each pita bread and spread to the corners
- 3. Top each pita with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (125 ml) of the BC Chicken and 1 tbsp (15 ml) of the BC Red Onion.
- 4. Top each pita with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (125 ml) of BC Mozzarella Cheese.
- 5. Place baking sheet on top rack of oven. Bake for 9-11 minutes or until cheese is melted. Top with chopped BC Basil and/or BC Mint.
- 6. Cool on baking rack for 5 minutes and enjoy.
