







#### **Sustainability Considerations**



• 0.5 ha. of cropland / capita for a nutritious diet on a sustainable basis

- B.C. at 4 million people 0.63 ha. of cropland / capita
- B.C. at 6 million people 0.42 ha. of cropland / capita

 2.5 billion ha. of quality cropland on earth, at 5.7 billion people (now 6 billion) = 0.25 ha of cropland / capita. 8.7 million people die each year from hunger or hunger-related causes

no death every 3.6 seconds
