Interview

If you like working with your hands and spending time outdoors, you'd probably enjoy working with Lori Baratta.

"I have an art background and I also really like plants," says Lori, who grew up in Burnaby and now grows sweet bell peppers at a large greenhouse in Delta. "Working in a greenhouse is perfect because it gives me the opportunity to be creative."

"I spend most of my time coordinating our Integrated Pest Management program, or IPM for short," explains Lori. "Basically, I'm responsible for monitoring and controlling greenhouse pests such as insects, weeds and plant diseases, mainly without the use of chemicals. IPM isn't like math—there's more than one way to solve a problem—so you get to use your imagination and try many different things."

One of the things Lori enjoys most about her job is the flexibility. Some days she might concentrate on a specific area, but she's not bound by a rigid schedule. "It's definitely not your typical nine-to-five office job," she assures. "When the sun is up, we're in the greenhouse.

"I love the feeling of being in the greenhouse because you feel like you're working outside all day. Plus, you spend the whole year growing a crop, so you can literally see how your daily decisions make a difference in the crop. I find that very rewarding."

To be successful, Lori says it's important to have a keen eye for detail, along with good organization and problem-solving skills. You also need to keep up with the rapid advances in greenhouse technology.

"You're always learning," she assures. "Even the growers that have been doing it for 30 years are still learning. There's always something you can do better next year."

"I took a two-year horticulture technician diploma program, specializing in greenhouse production. Before I went to college, I worked at a greenhouse for about a year and that was a really good experience."
